







Consultation on Proposed Submission Local Plan now open

The consultation for Winchester City Council's Proposed Submission Local Plan 'Regulation 19' is now open and will run until 23:59 hours on 13 October 2024.

The council is encouraging all residents, businesses, and organisations in the Winchester district to have their say. The draft plan sets out the council's vision for future development across the Winchester district – outside the South Down's National Park. It covers Winchester city, the market towns, villages, and countryside.

The council are hosting public drop-in sessions across the district and encourage residents to attend to find out more about how the Local Plan addresses some major challenges and help them have their say.

Residents can attend any of the following drop-in sessions regardless of where they live:

- Winchester: 11 September 3-6pm, The Nutshell Theatre, Kings Walk SO23 8AF
- Wickham: 17 September 3.30pm 7.30pm, Wickham Community Centre, Mill Lane, PO17 5AL

Some key themes included within the Local Plan are:

The Climate Emergency and Cutting Carbon

The biggest challenge of all is Climate Change. The Plan sets amongst the highest standards possible for environmental design for homes and for commercial development – designed to cut carbon and cut bills. The draft plan's policies also ensure development is designed to help make it attractive, safe and easy to walk, cycle and use other low-carbon methods of transport, supporting the council's goal of being a carbon-neutral district by 2030.

Affordable Homes

It's harder and harder for all ages, and especially younger people to find a suitable home they can afford. This plan takes a new approach to affordable housing targets – replacing an 'expectation' that was too often missed, with a minimum requirement that developers must achieve.

Chalk Streams and Rivers

Alongside neighbouring authorities, the district faces the challenge of protecting our district's chalk streams and rivers alongside neighbouring authorities. The plan sets requirements for nutrient neutrality.

The Natural Environment

This local plan takes the approach of 'brownfield first' – both in prioritising the use of previously developed land over green fields, but also in the phasing of development. The sites proposed are those which have the best sustainability, can deliver affordable homes, and have the least environmental impact on our district. Over 90% of the sites that developers put forward have not been included in this plan.

In total, the draft Plan includes over 80 policies covering other themes including the historic environment, creating a vibrant economy and biodiversity and open space amongst others.

Cllr Jackie Porter, Cabinet Member for Place and the Local Plan says:

'This Local Plan is the result of over three years of work and has been shaped from feedback from multiple consultations — it's a plan that'll protect our environment while ensuring affordable homes for the benefit of our children and grandchildren. To have this plan adopted now will mean our district's development will be carefully managed and controlled, setting out a strong and sustainable future. As always, we encourage each and everyone of our district's residents and businesses to share their views in what is the final stage of our plan before we submit it to government.'

The Regulation 19 consultation is the final stage of developing the Plan before it is submitted to the Secretary of State and the Planning Inspectorate for examination in public. This timetable is in line with the guidelines and timetable of submitting Local Plans before any policy changes result from the government's current consultation into the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF).



What is the Local Plan?

The Local Plan is a document produced by Winchester City Council to address local housing need, the economy, environmental considerations including the climate emergency, community infrastructure as well as strategic infrastructure needs. The document is produced by Winchester City Council in its role as the local planning authority, to set out what development may be allowed up to 2038, it does not cover the whole of the district because the South Downs National Park Authority has responsibility for planning matters in a large part of the council's area (around 40% of the district) and they have made their own plan.

The government planning a revised version of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). At the same time it has introduced a new methodology to calculate housing need. For Winchester this will result in an increase from the existing target of 576 dwellings per annum to a revised target of 1099 dwellings per annum. However the government has provided transitional arrangements which will allow local plans which are at an advanced stage to submit to the planning inspectorate and be assessed under the existing NPPF a provided they are submitted within one month of the new version being published. To take advantage of this opportunity and avoid having to re write the plan Winchester City Council brought forward the Regulation 19 Consultation. Deadline for responses was 13 October.



What is Regulation 19?

The Regulation 19 Plan represents the Local Plan as the council intends to submit to the Planning Inspectorate for their consideration,

It is the last stage of developing the plan before submitting the draft Local Plan to the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to hold an independent examination of the Plan. By bringing forward the date of submission of the plan, Winchester City Council hopes to take advantage of transitional arrangements in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPFF) and have their plan assessed against the existing version of the NPPF and existing housing numbers.

The representations made at Regulation 18 consultation have been taken into consideration in preparing this final version. This means that the Regulation 19 consultation comments will only be accepted on the soundness of the plan.

Why did Winchester Action on the Climate Crisis (WinACC) respond to the regulation 19 consultation?

We are living in unprecedented times. We are pleased that Winchester City Council has declared a climate emergency and support them in ensuring that Winchester district treads as lightly on the planet as it can. We know that we need to build more homes and infrastructure for our growing population. We respond to these plans to make sure they will create as little impact on our environment as possible, and where possible improve the environment so that we contribute as little as possible to climate change.

The WinACC response to the consultation

Overall. WinACC supports the proposed new Local Plan. WinACC submitted responses on various aspects of the Local Plan including standards for







I am writing to inform you that Winchester City Council has published a 'Proposed Submission Winchester District Local Plan 2040' for a period of 6 weeks from 29th August 2024 until 23:59 hours on 13th October 2024.

This Local Plan consultation invites you to comment on whether the Plan complies with all relevant legislation ('legal compliance') and meets the tests of soundness set in the <u>National Planning Policy Framework</u> (NPPF). The Proposed Submission Local Plan is the Plan the Council intends to submit to the Government for independent examination and ultimately adopt as part of the Council's statutory Development Plan.

What does the Local Plan cover?

The new Local Plan 2040 will cover all of Winchester district except for the part that is within the South Downs National Park (which has its own Local Plan).

The Proposed Submission Local Plan sets out the development strategy and policy framework for the area and allocates or designates land accordingly. Once adopted, the new Local Plan will be used to guide decisions on planning applications. The Government is consulting on new housing requirements for the District and new rules for Local Plans - once any changes are finalised the Council will commence plan-making under any new system at the earliest opportunity

How has the Local Plan been prepared?

The Proposed Submission Local Plan has taken into account comments received on the 'Strategic Issues & Priorities' consultation document, published February 2021 and the 'Regulation 18' Draft Local Plan (see Response to Representations on the Regulation 18 Draft Local Plan), published November 2022. Along with the Local Plan 'evidence base', these have helped the Council to develop the planning policies and site allocations contained in the Proposed Submission Local Plan. An 'Integrated Impact Assessment' (including Sustainability Appraisal) and a Habitats Regulations Assessment of the Proposed Submission Local Plan is also published for consultation.

- a. **Positively prepared** providing a strategy which, as a minimum, seeks to meet the area's objectively assessed needs; and is informed by agreements with other authorities, so that unmet need from neighbouring areas is accommodated where it is practical to do so and is consistent with achieving sustainable development;
- b. **Justified** an appropriate strategy, taking into account the reasonable alternatives, and based on proportionate evidence;

- c. Effective deliverable over the plan period, and based on effective joint working on cross-boundary strategic matters that have been dealt with rather than deferred, as evidenced by the statement of common ground; and
- d. **Consistent with national policy** enabling the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in this Framework and other statements of national planning policy, where relevant.

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


