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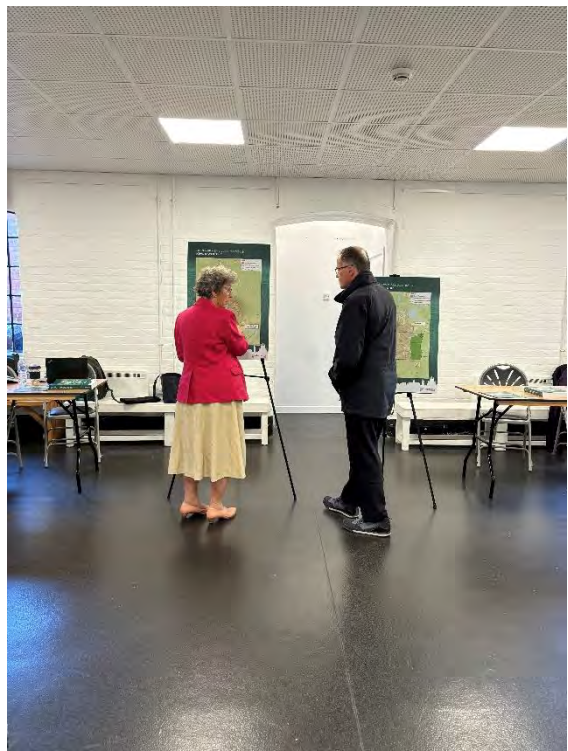



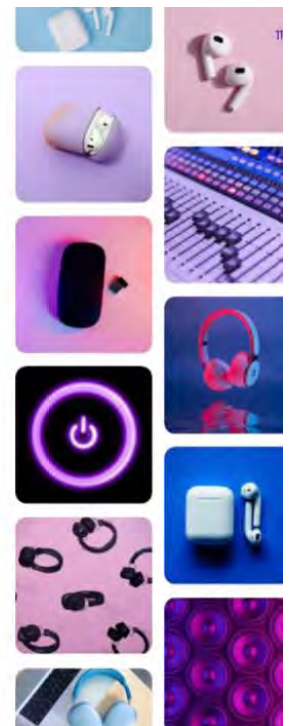

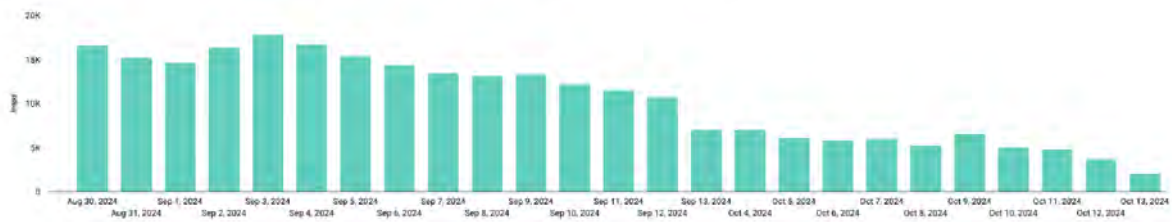

► Chart to show impressions delivered with average LTR (Listen Through Rate) by day

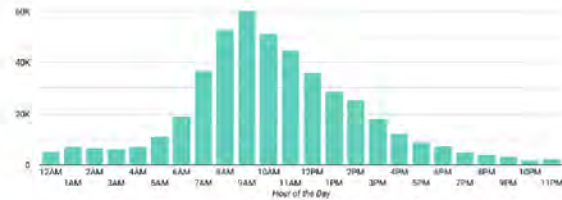
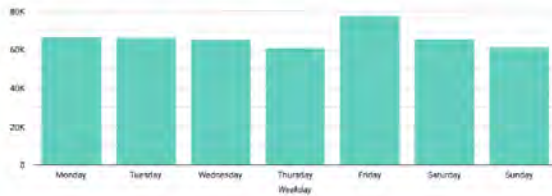

Delivery per day of week and hour

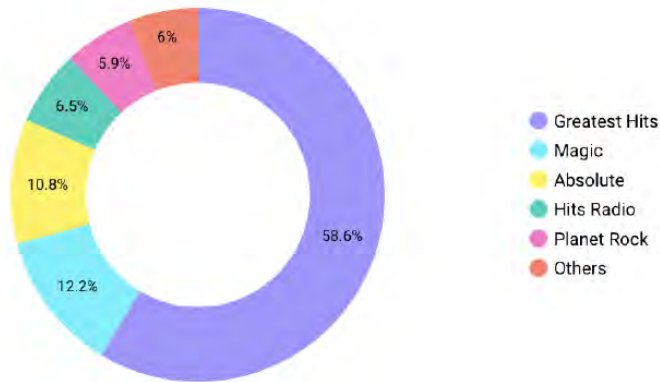
► Chart to show peak delivery times of your advert, by day and time

► Pie chart to show split of delivery by Bauer stations

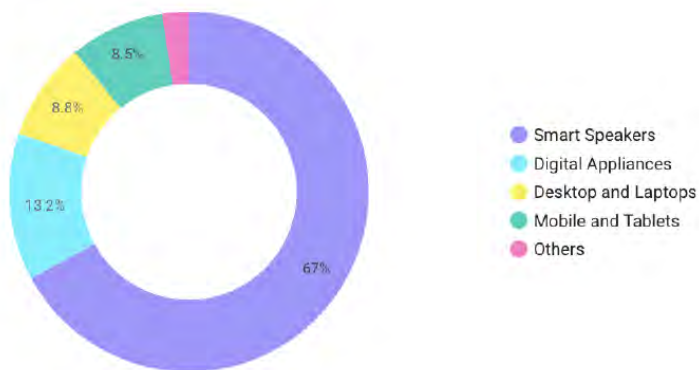

When it comes to drilling into the wall we can go to mainly utilise the mortar however, if the property is listed then there is a higher chance the mortar used is lime mortar which is brittle and likely to be less secure when drilling in and will likely be replaced by our engineers. The dimensions of the Charge Pod EV Charging Unit is 352mm x 140mm x 100mm. The particular unit has been chosen due to its small size and discrete nature, in keeping with the Grade II listed status of West Street. It is also an unobtrusive charging unit which is aesthetically pleasing when not in use as nothing will be visible from the road (West Street). It is also the option supplied by Audi which is another reason the charging unit was chosen. All works to be carried out on a private driveway charging unit meter.

Bob, 75, settles into life as a university student
 By Chris Atkinson



Bob Lakin, who has started studying philosophy, religion and ethics at the University of Winchester

A 75-year-old lecturer from Winchester has found a new passion in life by becoming a student at the city's oldest university.

Bob Lakin, of Eastgate Street, has enrolled on the philosophy, religion and ethics course at the University of Winchester, starting in October.

Bob, who has had many jobs during his life, including as a fire driver and a police officer, started the course of study at Winchester earlier this year.

He told the Chronicle: "I signed up for the course, an adult education course, at the University of Winchester and I did a year's worth of philosophy with a lecturer called Chris Haggard, who was very good. I just to enjoy it so much, that I thought I could have this."

Bob is now the only education course student at the university, calling it "a unique experience for them as well as for me. I was quite apprehensive in the hopes, I was quite apprehensive because universities get quite a bit of stick for what you might call 'progressive culture', and I thought I might fall out of that."

But in fact, the ideas of diversity, equity and inclusion actually seem to apply within their ethos, and everyone's been fine and so one seems to think it's not remarkable to see an old guy."

"I'm beginning to realise that it's tough. There's a lot to do, a lot to read, a lot to learn. But that is why you're there. It is going to be a steep learning curve I think, because of it. A lot of stuff you have to access you have to be pretty good at diving around on different IT systems, and so that definitely isn't a comfort zone, and definitely not a comfort zone for people my age."

"That is the immediate bit, but I'm looking at, but I'm getting through it. I'm finding the things I need to find. I'm in the process of finding out what I really don't know, so you feel a little bit, not out of your depth, but you think 'Oh, I didn't realise that I'd have to know that.'"

Bob said he's not yet sure what he will do once he has completed his degree, saying: "I think, once I get into it a little bit more, I'll know what I like. It's quite a diverse course, and I'll know what particularly is my direction."

"But I'm not going to say 'Oh, it's just a vanity project, and I'm not going to do anything', I'm definitely going to do something. Maybe even if it's just to encourage people to make the most of their older age."

Obesity on the increase

More than 100,000 people were admitted to hospital last year for obesity-related complications, a growing public health challenge for the government to take action against.

Latest NHS Digital figures show obesity was the primary secondary cause of around 100 hospital admissions for patients in Hampshire in the 2023 financial year. This was up from the year before, when there were around 92,740 admissions.

Nationally, admissions have increased 10 per cent since last year, when there were 1.1 million recorded. Earlier this month, the government confirmed it will introduce legislation to ban companies advertising products deemed high in fat, salt and sugar on TV before 9pm. It will also include a total ban on paid-for online adverts for these products.

The ban, which was first proposed by Boris Johnson in 2021, will come into force in October 2025.

Dr Keweenaw Hasbani, head of research and impact at Action on Sugar, said: "The rise in obesity and the unhealthy food environment we are surrounded with are key public health factors which need to be urgently addressed by the government."

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Hampshire fire engines donated to Tanzania

Two fire engines from Hampshire, which were replaced by newer models earlier this year, have arrived in the city of Dar es Salaam in Tanzania.

The vehicles were withdrawn from service in July, before being given to FireAid, which shipped them across to the African country where they arrived in August. FireAid is an alliance of organisations providing donations of fire and rescue aid and training to countries facing the greatest challenges. Hampshire Fire and Rescue

Service Director of Corporate Services, Matt Robertson, said: "We are fortunate to be able to provide all the tools and training our firefighters need to make their jobs as safe as possible. By providing these redundant vehicles to FireAid we know that they will continue to be used to save lives out in Tanzania."

The two Volvo fire engines first arrived in Hampshire in 2001. One was based in Basingstoke before becoming a reserve vehicle, and the other was used in Fareham, then Hayling Island, then the Isle of Wight.

Ferry suspended

Damage to the Hythe Ferry pontoon and its supporting structure have been discovered and it has therefore been deemed unsafe to continue operation of the ferry until further notice. The operator apologised for the inconvenience. At the time of writing they were unable to say when services would begin again.

By-election

Satvir Kaur, now the new MP for Southampton Test, has resigned as a City Councillor. A by-election to elect a new councillor for Shirley ward has now been called, which will take place in due course. She wrote: "Serving as councillor for Shirley ward for over 13 years has been a privilege and an honour. I can best serve the people of Shirley as their new Member of Parliament and by giving this new role my full attention and commitment."

Bottle bank removal

Eastleigh Borough Council will remove glass bottle banks throughout the borough from 9th September due to a number of recurring issues at them, such as fly-tipping, vandalism, litter, misuse, and contamination. Residents are encouraged to make use of the fortnightly kerbside glass recycling service operated by the council.

M3 closed twice in 24 hours after collisions

■ Pedestrian jumped in front of vehicle on A33 and tried to open the door

The M3 northbound was closed last Friday afternoon and then again on Saturday morning after two separate collisions.

The police were called at 2.05pm on Friday 30th August to a report of a man found seriously injured in the northbound carriageway near Chandler's Ford.

The police believe he may have been involved in a collision with a vehicle which did not stop at the scene.

The injured man, in his 60s, was taken to hospital with potentially life-threatening injuries.

The northbound M3 was completely closed between junctions 12

(Allbrook) and 11 (Compton) until around 5.30pm while emergency services dealt with the scene of the incident. There were long delays for traffic in the area, as far back as junction 9 of the M7 and well north of Winchester on the M3 southbound.

The police would like to speak to any witnesses to this incident and anyone with relevant dash cam footage.

In an unconnected incident the next morning, a man suffered life threatening injuries in a collision on the M3 just north of Winchester.

The police were called at 6.25am on Saturday 31st August, to reports

of a man in the road on the A33, which runs parallel to the M3. This was followed by a second call, from a woman who had been driving on the A33 when a man jumped in front of her vehicle and tried to open the door.

At about 6.30am a collision occurred on the M3 involving a car and a pedestrian, who matches the description of the man seen a short time before on the A33.

The pedestrian was taken to hospital in a life threatening condition.

The M3 northbound was closed between junctions 9 (the A34) and 8 (the A303) while the police carried out an investigation. It was

re-opened during the afternoon.

PC Haidam Zubaidi said: "We are appealing for anyone who saw the man on the A33 or the M3 to come forward and speak to us. Were you driving in the area at the time? Do you have a dashcam fitted to your vehicle? If you have any information please come forward and speak to us."

A 37-year-old man from Southampton has been arrested on suspicion of driving a vehicle whilst unfit through drugs. He has been released under investigation.

Anyone who can help with the police investigations into either of these incidents is asked to telephone 101.

Branch line to close for three weeks

■ Brockenhurst to Lyminster line to be closed from 26th October to 3rd November and 21st December to 5th January

Work on the approach to Lyminster Pier will mean that the Lyminster branch railway line will be closed between Saturday 26th October and Sunday 3rd November, with buses replacing trains.

During this eight-day closure, Network Rail engineers will be replacing three quarters of a mile's worth of track between Brockenhurst and Lyminster Pier to help improve reliability and reduce the number of faults on the line.

Once laid, the new track will then be treated by a specialist Land Rover able to travel both on the road and the railway – known as a 'Sand Rover' – which will drive along the tracks and apply a sticky sand-like gel to help the train wheels grip the tracks in wet and slippery conditions.

Engineers will also begin the first of a two-stage programme of work to strengthen the viaduct which runs over the river between Lyminster Town and Lyminster Pier. This will include improving the durability of the wrought iron columns which support the structure as well as carrying out preventative works to make sure the viaduct continues to safely carry passengers over Lyminster River into the future.

This second phase of this work will be completed at the end of this year, when the line will be closed from 21st December to 5th January.

Mark Goodall, Network Rail Wessex route director, said: "We're sorry for any inconvenience this work will cause and thank passengers for their patience during this period."

This work is critical for the continued safe and reliable running of the Lyminster branch line over Lyminster River which we know is a popular line that provides visitors with

regular ferry connections to the Isle of Wight.

"During this time, the railway between Brockenhurst and Lyminster Pier will be closed, and a rail replacement bus service will be in operation to allow our engineers to safely complete their work. We're working closely with our train operator partners South Western Railway and Wightlink Ferry company to ensure passengers can continue their journeys."

An SWR spokesperson said: "With our colleagues at Network Rail set to carry out vital

maintenance between Brockenhurst and Lyminster Pier, we're advising customers to check before travelling. Buses will replace trains, calling at Lyminster Town."

"Customers should also note that there will be a closure between Southampton Central and Brockenhurst on the first weekend of the closure, again with buses replacing trains. We're sorry for the disruption that this will cause and would encourage customers to check before travelling."

Thomas Michael Prior, 35, of Pennywell Gardens, New Milton, is due to appear at Southampton Magistrates' Court on 22nd October, charged with being concerned in the importation of a Class B drug. This follows a reported importation incident at East Midlands Airport in October 2022 and the search of a property on Pennywell Gardens in November 2022.

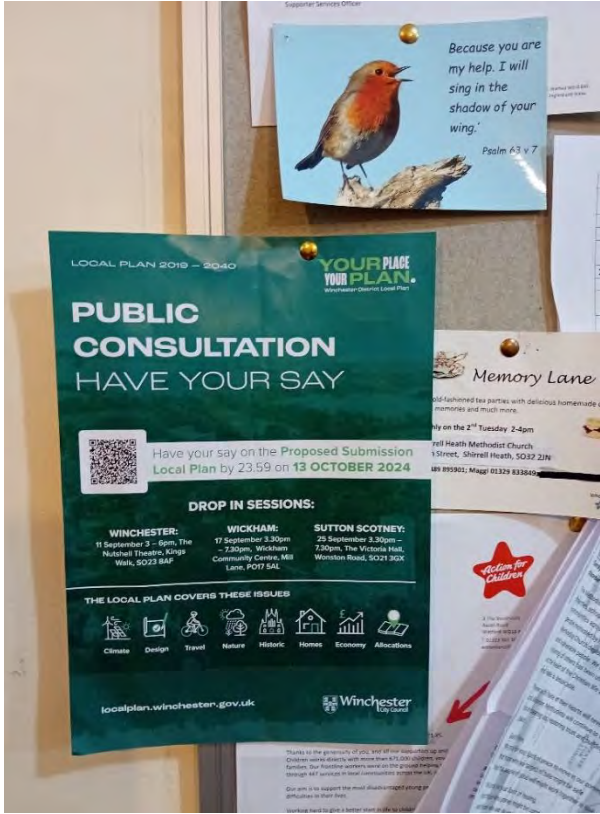

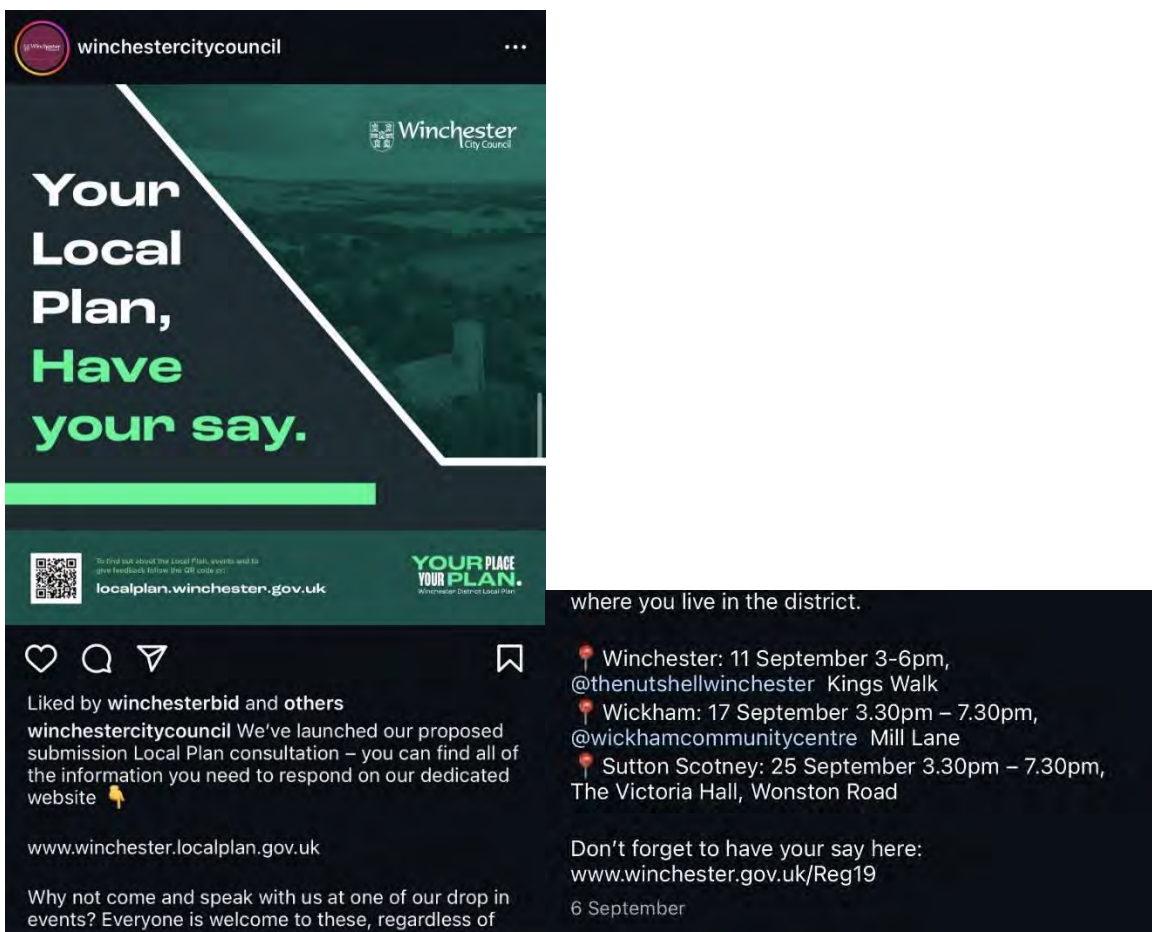

What is the Local Plan?

The Local Plan is a **document produced by Winchester City Council** to address local **housing** need, the **economy**, **environmental** considerations including the **climate emergency**, **community infrastructure** as well as **strategic infrastructure** needs. The document is produced by Winchester City Council in its role as the **local planning authority**, to set out what development may be allowed up to 2038. It does not cover the whole of the district because the South Downs National Park Authority has responsibility for planning matters in a large part of the council's area (around 40% of the district) and they have made their own plan.

The government planning a revised version of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). At the same time it has introduced a **new methodology to calculate housing need**. For Winchester this will result in an **increase** from the existing target of 676 dwellings per annum to a **revised target of 1099 dwellings per annum**. However the government has provided **transitional arrangements** which will allow local plans which are at an advanced stage to submit to the planning inspectorate and be assessed under the existing NPPF a provided they are submitted within one month of the new version being published. To take advantage of this opportunity and **avoid having to re write the plan** Winchester City Council brought forward the **Regulation 19 Consultation**. Deadline for responses was 13 October.



What is Regulation 19?

The Regulation 19 Plan represents the Local Plan as the **council intends to submit to the Planning Inspectorate** for their consideration.

It is the **last stage of developing the plan** before submitting the draft Local Plan to the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to hold an independent examination of the Plan. By bringing forward the date of submission of the plan, Winchester City Council hopes to take advantage of transitional arrangements in the **National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF)** and have their plan assessed against the existing version of the NPPF and **existing housing numbers**.

The representations made at Regulation 18 consultation have been taken into consideration in preparing this final version. This means that the Regulation 19 consultation **comments will only be accepted on the soundness of the plan**.

Why did Winchester Action on the Climate Crisis (WinACC) respond to the regulation 19 consultation?

We are living in **unprecedented times**. We are pleased that Winchester City Council has declared a climate emergency and support them in ensuring that Winchester district treads as lightly on the planet as it can. We know that we need to build more homes and infrastructure for our growing population. We respond to these plans to make sure they will create as little impact on our environment as possible, and where possible improve the environment so that we **contribute as little as possible to climate change**.

The WinACC response to the consultation

The Local Plan sets out the amount of new houses to be built in the Winchester district over the next 20 years.

No new housing has been allocated to Swanmore over and above the 100 houses already being built at The Lakes. However, we have been recategorised as a large rural settlement, rather than an intermediate one. We have asked for more information on how this decision was reached to see if we can/ need to challenge the decision.

Reforms to the National Planning Policy Framework being brought in by the new government will mean an increased housing requirement for the district, the current estimate is 500 more houses per year above the existing provision. Winchester is talking about developing a follow up plan in the new year to address any shortfall in housing need. So there will be further reviews and changes to the Local Plan.

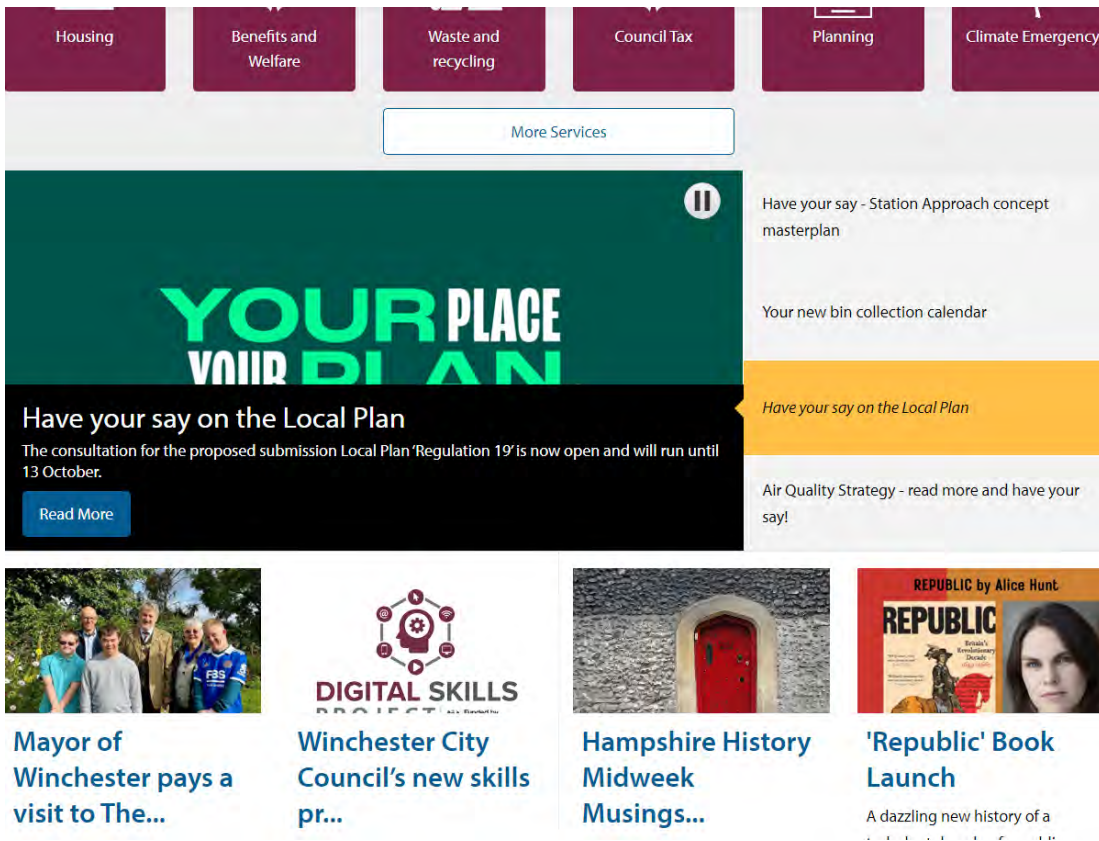

I am writing to inform you that Winchester City Council has published a **‘Proposed Submission Winchester District Local Plan 2040’** for a period of **6 weeks** from **29th August 2024 until 23:59 hours on 13th October 2024**.

This Local Plan consultation invites you to comment on whether the Plan complies with all relevant legislation (‘legal compliance’) and meets the tests of soundness set in the [National Planning Policy Framework](#) (NPPF). The Proposed Submission Local Plan is the Plan the Council intends to submit to the Government for independent examination and ultimately adopt as part of the Council's statutory Development Plan.

What does the Local Plan cover?

The new Local Plan 2040 will cover all of Winchester district except for the part that is within the South Downs National Park (which has its own Local Plan).

The Proposed Submission Local Plan sets out the development strategy and policy framework for the area and allocates or designates land accordingly. Once adopted, the new Local Plan will be used to guide decisions on planning applications. The Government is consulting on new housing requirements for the District and new rules for Local Plans - once any changes are finalised the Council will commence plan-making under any new system at the earliest opportunity

How has the Local Plan been prepared?

The Proposed Submission Local Plan has taken into account comments received on the ‘Strategic Issues & Priorities’ consultation document, published February 2021 and the ‘Regulation 18’ Draft Local Plan (see [Response to Representations on the Regulation 18 Draft Local Plan](#)), published November 2022. Along with the Local Plan ‘evidence base’, these have helped the Council to develop the planning policies and site allocations contained in the Proposed Submission Local Plan. An ‘Integrated Impact Assessment’ (including Sustainability Appraisal) and a Habitats Regulations Assessment of the Proposed Submission Local Plan is also published for consultation.



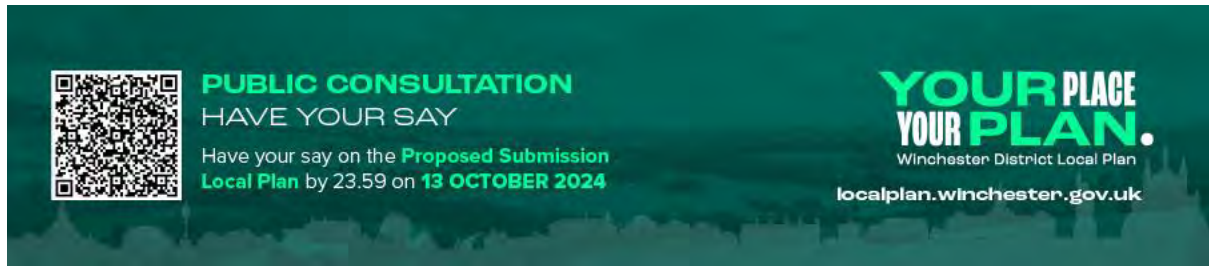

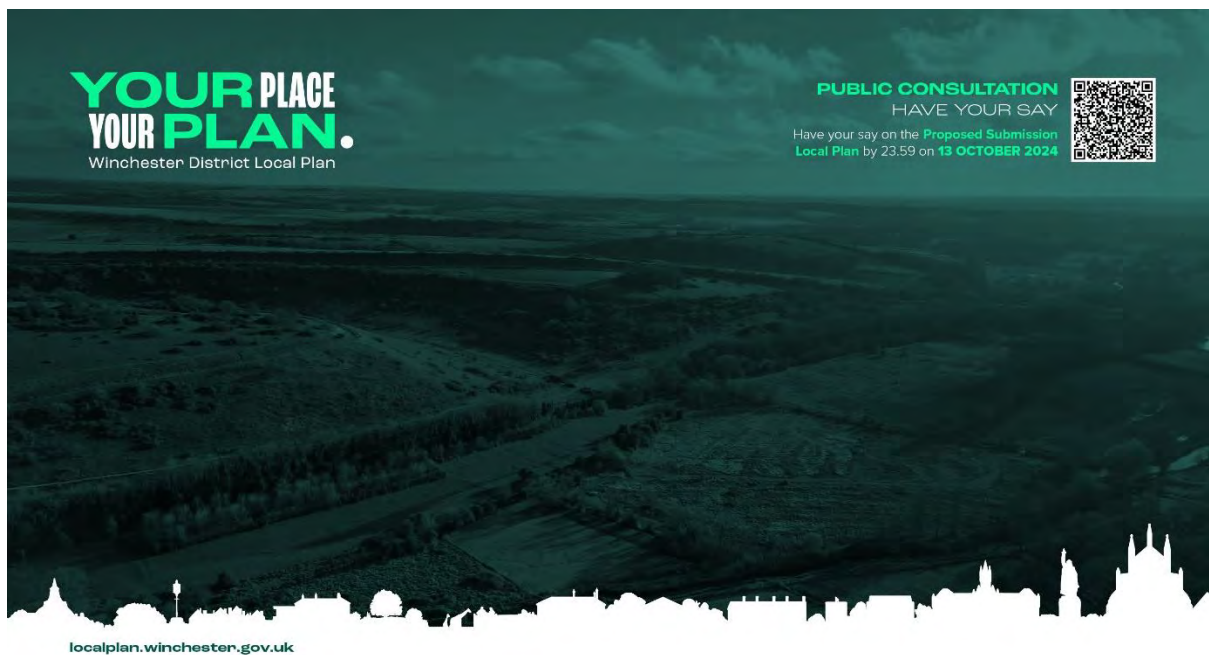

Overview

What is a Local Plan?
