the Winchester District Local Plan 2019-2039 notes at paragraph 7.21 that one of the key roles of a Local Plan is to allocate Local Green Spaces. At paragraph 7.22 it recognises that "the designation of Local Green Space allows communities to identify and protect green areas of particular importance to them." This is reiterated at paragraph 7.77, where the document notes that "the importance of retaining open spaces has been highlighted through the process of consulting local communities on their needs and aspirations, but no Local Green Space designations have been suggested." The paragraph goes on to note that "parishes" were asked to put forward spaces of importance to them, "most if not all of which" are now listed in the 2022 WCC Open Space Assessment that was prepared by council officers to support Local Plan development.	
The City of Winchester community is made up of largely unparished wards so would not have been covered by any "parish" consultation exercise. Nevertheless, the 2022 WCC Open Space Assessment lists a large number of sports grounds, parks and recreation grounds, and other green spaces within these wards. It also notes that the majority of these wards carry a deficit of both sports grounds and parks/recreation grounds, relative to the government's population-based open space standards. For example, St Paul has a shortfall of 7.48 hectares of sports grounds and 4.54 hectares of parks and recreation grounds, while St Barnabas has a shortfall of 5 hectares of sports grounds and 4.7 hectares of parks and recreation grounds, according to the WCC Open Space Assessment.	
Given these widespread and significant shortfalls in recreational green space across the city, it is even more important to give the remaining sports grounds, parks and recreation grounds adequate protection from development, now and in the future. Indeed, the only city (Winchester Town) ward with a notable provision of sports	

grounds over and above the open space standards is St Michael, which is home to the city's only sports grounds benefitting from legal protection under Fields In Trust designation.	
Unfortunately, the protection afforded by Local Plan policies – such as the proposed NE10 – has proven inadequate to date. For example, several areas of open space "protected" by policy DM5 and/or countryside status in the existing Local Plan have now been developed for housing. It will therefore be important to designate key areas of recreational open space as Local Green Space in order to ensure their retention and ongoing availability for community use.	
We have identified the following areas that serve the Winchester city community, which have particular "recreational value" and which are also listed as sports grounds or parks/recreation grounds in the 2022 WCC Open Space Assessment. We are hereby making a formal request for these sites to be designated as Local Green Space (LGS) in the emerging Local Plan for 2019-2039:

## Amendments to supporting text

7.75. The Plan aims to concentrate development within the most sustainable locations in existing towns and villages, while retaining their green spaces where they have a recognised recreational, biodiversity, heritage or amenity value.

7.76. Open areas with an important amenity, biodiversity or heritage value contribute substantially to the appearance and local distinctiveness of the area and help define the character of towns and villages. These spaces may also be performing other important environmental functions, such as ecosystem services. The local planning authority will continue to protect these important open areas both within and outside settlements. Many of the important parks and recreation grounds serving the settlements are outside the settlement boundaries, in the countryside, where they are protected by policies such as Policy SP3.

7.77. The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) provides for local communities to identify 'Local Green Space' of particular importance to them. The importance of retaining open spaces has been highlighted through the process of consulting local communities on their needs and aspirations, but no Local Green Space designations have been suggested. In preparing the revised Open Space Assessment in 2020 parishes were asked to put forward all the green spaces of particular importance to them for consideration. Most if not all of these green spaces are now in the Open Space Assessment 2022 and will be afforded protection by the 'protecting open areas' policy. The NPPF is clear that this designation will not be appropriate for most green or open spaces and that particular criteria will need to be met. Therefore, this Plan does not seek to designate any Local Green Spaces, but will protect important open areas through other policies, such as Policy NE3, NE7, NE10 and the policies relating to development in the countryside.

7.78. Policy NE10 identifies and protects open areas that are important for one or more of the criteria listed in the policy. In relation to biodiversity, spaces are only included where they have a recognised nature designation (e.g. SINCs or SSSIs) and only areas with scheduled monuments are included in relation to heritage. Policy NE10 also does not identify all areas that may be considered to contribute to green infrastructure, which are covered under Policy NE4. Not all the areas covered by Policy NE10 will necessarily

have public access, but still merit designation for other reasons, such as contributing to visual amenity, or cultural significance. Some private sports grounds fall within this category.

7.79. The Open Space Assessment which is a background document to the Local Plan, lists the important open areas, whether they are within defined settlement boundaries or not, with an explanation of the role they are performing and why they are important, including the extent of public accessibility where known. The Strategy goes on to identify specific needs, deficits and surpluses of publically accessible open space. The Open Space Strategy therefore refers to some spaces that will not be subject to Policy NE10 but are nonetheless important when considering the extent and nature of provision and needs in an area, including sites outside settlement boundaries.

7.80. Policy NE3 requires that where important open areas, including hard surfaced areas such as courts, are proposed to be lost in part or completely, replacement open space should be provided nearby. Where this is not possible, then the community benefit of the development should be shown to clearly outweigh the harm caused by the loss of the open space. However, many forms of development are seen in planning terms to 'benefit the community' and this can leave open space in a vulnerable position.

7.81. Therefore, the harm caused by the loss or the reduction of the important open area, both individually and cumulatively, should be fully understood with regard to the benefits or 'services' the open space is providing. These benefits and services can be economic, environmental or social and can include:

- Character and local distinctiveness;
- Biodiversity;
- Heritage value;
- Water and flood management;
- Climate change adaptation and mitigation;
- Opportunities for improving health and well being e.g. through informal or formal physical activity, etc.

## Amendments to policy

Open areas within defined settlement boundaries which have an important amenity, biodiversity, heritage or recreational value, as shown on the Policies Map and detailed in the Open Space Assessment, will be protected from development. Built development will only be permitted on these spaces where it accords with the Development Plan and:

i. The proposal is for a facility which is ancillary to the function of the open space; and

- ii. The contribution of the open area to the character of the wider area is maintained or enhanced. Development may exceptionally be permitted where it is demonstrated that the benefit to the community clearly outweighs the harm caused by the loss of all or part of the facility, and options for developing elsewhere have been explored
- iii. The replacement open space is provided and located as close as possible to the open space that would be affected by the development'.
